These are not the words of one scientist, or one government, But of 150 scientists, from 50 governments, who for three years, systematically analysed 15,000 scientific sources and summarized –

And the casualty is one million endangered species

"And us".

The scientists say:

Nature is declining globally at rates unprecedented in human history — and the rate of species extinctions is accelerating, with grave impacts on people around the world now likely.

We are eroding the very foundations of our economies, livelihoods, food security, health and quality of life worldwide.

The essential, interconnected web of life on Earth is getting smaller and increasingly frayed.

This loss is a direct result of human activity and constitutes a direct threat to human well-being in all regions of the world."
